


Community Care Hub NETWORK ROLES

A Community Care Hub (CCH) is a community-focused entity that organizes and supports a network of community-based organizations (CBO) providing services to address health-related social needs. A CCH centralizes administrative functions and operational infrastructure, including contracting with health care organizations, payment operations, management of referrals, service delivery fidelity and compliance, technology, information security, data collection, and reporting.

One stop for contracting and billing for payers and providers




